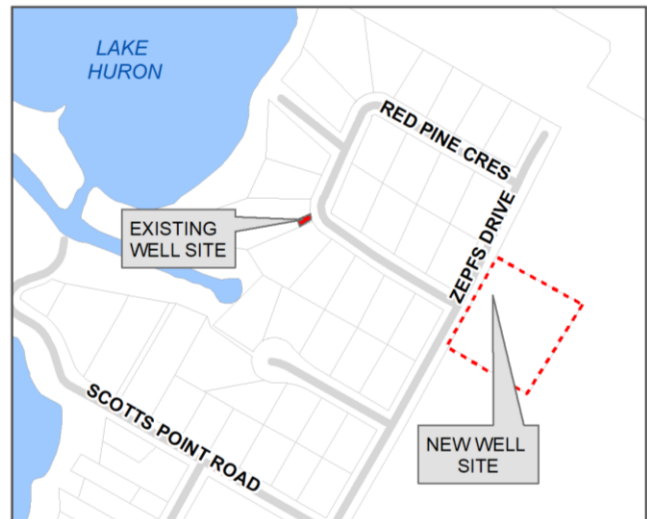


Municipality of Kincardine Municipal Class Environmental Assessment for Scott's Point Well Replacement

Notice of Study Completion

The Project: The Municipality of Kincardine undertook a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) to identify and evaluate options for the replacement of the Scott's Point municipal well. Inspections of the existing well indicate the casing is in poor condition. Following consideration of alternative solutions, a new well at a new municipal well site was identified the preliminary preferred solution. A test well was drilled at a new potential well site at 26 Zepf's Drive (see the included map). The test well provided the desired quantity of water and quality similar to the existing supply. Given this, the preferred solution is a new supply well at 26 Zepf's Drive.



The Environmental Assessment Process: The project was investigated following the MCEA process set out for Schedule 'B' activities. The purpose of the MCEA is to evaluate solutions related to infrastructure needs and projects following a logical and defined decision-making process. The process incorporated the evaluation of alternative solutions, potential environmental impacts, consultation, and identified how impacts may be mitigated.
