

STAY SAFE. BEFORE YOU CLEAR A BLOCKED LINE—CALL EPCOR!


As a drain cleaning professional, you may accidently strike a cross bore while clearing a plugged sewer.

When a cross bore is struck by equipment such as a motorized auger, power-snake or other root-cutting equipment, natural gas can leak into the sewer system and up into the affected property, which could lead to personal injury or an explosion.

STEPS TO TAKE BEFORE CLEARING A BLOCKED SEWER

- 1 Once you have arrived on site and determined the blockage is from external factors, be sure to call EPCOR. Only blockages outside the home are at risk of cross bores.
 - EPCOR considers this an emergency call and will meet you at the location to determine if a cross bore is detected. There is no charge to you or the property owner for this service.
- 2 Wait for EPCOR to check its records for cross bores in the area and confirm if an in-line camera inspection is needed.
 - Do not attempt to use your own video equipment to determine if a cross bore is present.
- 3 Only begin to clear the line once EPCOR has provided confirmation it is safe to proceed.
