Council approved the design of the Boardwalk at Station Beach. GMBLueplan will proceed with developing tender documents for construction. The 2025 budget will include a proposal for construction of the boardwalk.

Council approved awarding the contract to dredge the Kincardine Marina to Huron District Contracting Limited in the amount of \$281,733.44.
